So far, 2013 has been a year of amazing growth for Books for Me!

We are all so excited and pleased that we are now able to offer our program to so many more families via some new locations. As of May 1st, over 8,500 books have been chosen by children from all over the Vancouver area. For many of them, these are their first “forever” books. For others, their Books for Me! books allow them to start building their own small collection.

This is remarkable growth, since we started with just one location only a year and a half ago. We hope to expand further - there are always more schools and other locations asking for Books for Me!

We always appreciate feedback from the program locations and want to share some recent comments from the principal of one of our program schools: *...a resounding YES for the program! It has been a wonderful opportunity for children to get books into their homes when they might otherwise never have that opportunity...here’s quotes from some of our teachers: “...it’s fabulous, I think it’s fantastic, the kids love it...the children just love having their own books...even the older kids get really excited” I love how it supports our most important and crucial literacy goal.*
