In February, students at Henderson Annex Elementary School were greeted unusually by children's author Gina McMurchy-Barber. Lee Fodi Donated Presentation is Prize for Richardson



Lee Edward Fodi is an award-winning children's author and illustrator who visited with the students at Richardson Elementary in North Delta in October 2013. Lee very kindly donated his reading to Books for Me! as a reward for the students there whose book drive brought in the most books of any school that year - almost 2,000 books! He enchanted the children with funny stories of his childhood in the Okanagan, how he became an author and illustrator, and the process he uses to get his stories from his imagination into a book. Books for Me! hosted the book launch of Jewish Fairytale Feasts, a beautifully illustrated collection of Jewish folktales with easy recipes, tales retold by Jane Yolan, recipes by Heidi Stemple and illustrations by Sima Elizabeth Shefrin. Illustrator Elizabeth Shefrin was on hand to sign cop-



ies of the book. It was a very successful event - lots of books were sold, funds were raised for Books for Me! and the 60 or so guests enjoyed lots of home baked goodies from the book.

DID YOU KNOW...?

According to a 2010 survey in the UK, "twice as many young people who have books of their own compared with those who do not have their own books enjoy reading either very much or quite a lot." This group also has twice the daily readers. The results also showed that "nearly twice as many young people who do not have their own books at home, compared to those who do, agreed with the statements that reading is more for girls than boys, that reading is hard, that they cannot find anything to read that interests them, that they only read when they have to and that they do not read as well as other students in their class. Also, they were three times more likely to agree with the statement that reading is boring and that they only read in class."
